Elizabeth (Betty) Moehring Chatham was born August 24, 1924, in Big Rapids, Michigan. She passed away in Little Rock, Arkansas on July 21, 2021, just shy of her 97th birthday.

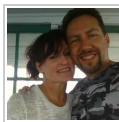
